ABSTRACT

-  Methods, Results, and Conclusions. Clear & concise description of the study in 150-300 words
-  Structured or unstructured format
-  Unstructured abstract has no headings; information presented in one paragraph
-  Structured abstract has defined headings: background, objective, methods, results, & conclusion

VERSUS

INTRODUCTION

-  First section of the paper with detailed background on the research topic
-  Explains the research gap and the proposed hypothesis
-  Describes the importance of the study
-  No information on methods, results, or conclusions used in the present study
