Jim Parsons has been playing the character in the TV series for eleven seasons now.





The character in the Carl Sagan's book and <u>film adaptation</u>, played by Jodie Foster is based on real-life astronomer Dr. Jill Tarter.







Professor Charles Xavier (X-Men series)
