# DOS



#### **Keep it Short**

Do not use a resume longer than 2 pages. Give only information that is relevant.



#### **Prioritize Experience Over Education**

Highlight your work experience. Your recruiter is more interested in the experience that you possess.



# **Tailor Your Resume According to the Job**Add skills that are relevant to the job. Use the right

keywords to make it through the initial screening.



#### **Focus on Your Achievements**

Highlight your achievements. Show your potential employer your capabilities.

## **DON'TS**



### Use an Unprofessional Email Address

Avoid an unprofessional email address. Use one which includes your name.



### **Include Personal Information**

Avoid personal information such as religion, race, marital status, photograph etc.



#### **Mention References Unless Asked**

Avoid adding references, give them to the employer only if they ask for it.
