- Dr. Zumelzu is a distinguished researcher, publishing expert, and material scientist with a career spanning more than 35 years. He is currently associated with the Faculty of Engineering Sciences at Universidad Austral de Chile.
- Dr. Zumelzu has authored, edited, and peer-reviewed more than 50 publications in journals that are indexed in the Web of Science; moreover, he has authored more than hundred publications (book content, conference papers, and project reports) that have been cited in other well-renowned DOAJ-, SciELO-indexed journals.
- He is a fluent Spanish speaker and has used his expertise in preparing scientific manuscripts with high editorials requirements and also to eliminate language complexity for peers facing difficulties with the English language. He has assisted many researchers in preparing scientific manuscripts that need to adhere to strict requirements of international peer-reviewed journals.
- Till date, Dr. Zumelzu has conducted numerous workshops and shared best practices in academic writing and publishing in Latin America, particularly for researchers in Ecuador and Chile. Ha has also contributed to the strengthening of the Inter-University Center for Andean Development, CINDA.
- Dr. Zumelzu is currently a referee/peer reviewer for research and development projects that are funded by the National Commission for Scientific and Technological Research (CONICYT), the National Fund for Scientific and Technological Development (FONDECYT), and the Fund for the Promotion of Scientific and Technological Development (FONDEF) in Chile.

Workshop Brief

Topic 1: Challenges in Academic Publishing—Role of English Language

For authors and graduate students whose primary language is not English, the most challenging aspect is conveying their research in a manner acceptable for publication in peer-reviewed international journals. Currently, many studies written by ESL authors are rejected by the journal editors themselves and do not even reach the stage of peer review. This presentation will provide researchers important and easy tips for correct usage of English language and grammar in academic writing.

For well-renowned journals, it is important to have both a credible editorial board and a rigorous peer review process as they help maintain and improve the impact of the papers that are published on a yearly basis.
