Tips on Suggesting Reviewers for Your Manuscript

- Find experts in your research field.
- Do not suggest reviewers you personally know (conflict of interest).
- Prepare a diverse list of reviewers from different institutions, related fields, etc.
- Avoid reviewers who work for your target journal or at your institution/university.
- Do a thorough background check (your reference list could serve as a good starting point).
- Avoid suggesting all reviewers from the same country (to avoid getting similar perspectives).
