



Description

All mentions should be in compliance with the guidelines stipulated by organizations such as ICMJE or COPE. Interestingly, determining authorship is one of the most common causes of conflict during the publication process.




Who Are Authors, Co-Authors, and Contributors?



Author

- Makes major contribution to the study
- Drafts/revises intellectual output
- Approves the final version of the manuscript
- Agrees to be accountable for the research work





Co-author


Contributor


- Does not qualify as an author/co-author
- Helps in acquiring funds, supervising research groups, extending administrative support, technical writing, editing, or proofreading

- Does not contribute significantly; plays a supplementary role
- All authors should be able to identify co-authors' work
